Dear Governor Deal:

I received your letter of March 8, 2013, encouraging my support for H.R. 803 – Supporting Knowledge and Investing in Lifelong Skills (SKILLS) Act – a proposal that attempts to update the Workforce Investment Act (WIA).

Unfortunately, I cannot support H.R. 803 because it does not adequately address the specialized employment and training needs of those at-risk in our community, including young people, veterans, older workers, the disabled and other special-needs groups. As structured, it appears the bill will pit special-needs groups against those facing far less barriers to employment. It would also gut a 40-year bipartisan effort to target services in a nuanced and sophisticated way. Groups with special needs deserve more targeted services.

As a former DeKalb County Commissioner and board member of the DeKalb Community Service Board (CSB) and four-term Congressman who has visited with board, staff and participants at targeted employment programs such as the Bobby Dodd Center and Goodwill Industries, I can personally attest that WIA funds are essential to special-needs Georgians. By lumping them in with all other job seekers, we will diminish their opportunities.

I appreciate you sharing your perspective on H.R. 803, but must respectfully disagree. I do want to continue to dialogue with you. Only by sharing our opinions and perspectives will we be able to reach common ground for the good of all Georgians.
