- To direct the Secretary of Transportation to establish a grant program to improve the preparation and representation of certain students in aviation-related fields, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Minorities in Aviation
 - 5 Education Act of 2023".

1 SEC. 2. BESSIE COLEMAN AVIATION EDUCATION PROGRAM.

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Transportation
3 shall establish the Bessie Coleman Aviation Education
4 Program to provide grants to eligible entities to improve
5 the preparation and representation of students, particu6 larly women and minorities, in aviation-related fields.

7 (b) AUTHORIZED ACTIVITIES.—A grant awarded
8 under this section may only be used for activities that in9 crease exposure and access to aviation-related education
10 and jobs through such means as—

(1) internships, apprenticeships, or scholarships
that offer students experience in the aviation industry;

14 (2) programs that introduce students to un15 manned aircraft systems (as the term is defined in
16 section 44801 of title 49, United States Code);

17 (3) career exploration and educational programs
18 that teach technical skills used in aviation mainte19 nance, or to improve existing such programs; and

20 (4) programs to increase the recruitment and
21 retention of underrepresented minorities in postsec22 ondary aviation degree programs.

23 (c) Application and Review Procedures.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—An eligible entity seeking a
grant under this section shall submit an application
to the Secretary at such time, in such manner, and

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containing such information as the Secretary may
 require, including a description of how grant funds
 will be used to increase exposure and access to avia tion-related education and jobs.

5 (2) PRIORITY.—In reviewing and selecting ap-6 plications for grants under this section, the Sec-7 retary shall give priority to applicants that propose 8 to use grant funds to encourage the participation of 9 women, minorities, and individuals in rural and 10 urban areas in the aviation industry.

(3) PARTNERSHIP WITH OTHER ENTITIES.—An
eligible entity may enter into a partnership agreement with an institution of higher education, a nonprofit organization, or another entity, to carry out
activities with a grant awarded under this section.

(d) GRANT AMOUNT.—The maximum amount of a
grant awarded under this section in a fiscal year shall be
\$500,000.

19 (e) DEFINITIONS.—In this subsection:

20 (1) ELIGIBLE ENTITY.—The term "eligible enti21 ty" means—
22 (A) a local educational agency;

- 23 (B) a State educational agency; and
- 24 (C) a State or local government.

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(2) INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION.—The
 term "institution of higher education" has the
 meaning given the term in section 101 of the Higher
 Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1001).

5 (3) LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGENCY.—The term
6 "local educational agency" has the meaning given
7 the term in section 8101 of the Elementary and Sec8 ondary Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 7801).

9 (4) STATE EDUCATIONAL AGENCY.—The term
10 "State educational agency" has the meaning given
11 the term in section 8101 of the Elementary and Sec12 ondary Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 7801).

(f) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section
\$5,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2023, 2024, 2025,
2026, and 2027.
